Many of the speakers echoed the sentiments of Dr. Sheela Ram, including the Keynote speaker, Prof. Dr.-Ing. Dr.M.A.Rainer Przywara, who is the current Rector of the Baden-Wurttemberg Cooperative University Heidenheim (DHBW), Germany. In his keynote address. Prof. Przywara presented a summary of his current research on a 'Modelbased analysis of the global spread of covid 19'. This insightful model supported the need for increased vaccinations, especially in Africa. It also indicated that African countries have comparably low death rates of the infected due to the young population. However, strategies aimed at achieving herd immunity should be pursued.
